Social Studies

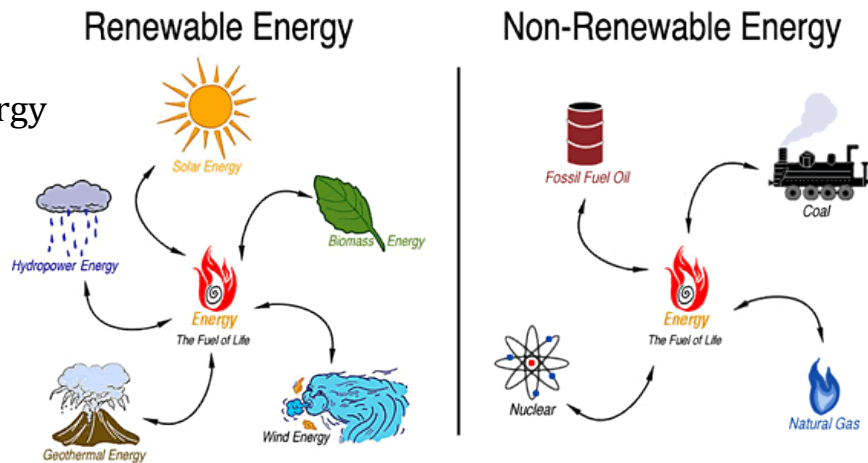
