Ms. Perez & Ms. Alison Highlights

This week :

- In Language Arts we reviewed beginning sounds, worked on our handwriting, and reviewed syllables. We are wrapping up eating the alphabet with only a few letters to go. This week we ate W, C, N and T. Thank you Mehreen for the Naan and cucumber dip. The kids loved eating N for Naan. During dinner, ask your child to say the beginning sounds in whatever they are eating. We added the sight word "blue" to our Word Wall, and wrote about bats and halloween for our Writer's Corner. The kids have learned 6 sight words- a, see, like, red, I, blue.
- We read a book about Dia De Los Muertos and had a celebration in class decorating sugar skulls and setting up an altar. The kids enjoyed eating Pan De Los Muertos, drinking Abuelita hot chocolate and made homemade tortillas.
- In Math, we played Dreambox and "Build It". Build it is game using pennies on ten frames to build a number.
- In Science we carved into our pumpkins and explored what was inside. The students estimated how many seeds were inside, and they used ten frames to count them. Our pumpkin had 416 seeds!

Ms. Hope & Ms. Mayes Highlights

This week :

- In Language Arts we finally finished all the letters of the day! We are working hard on identifying and matching letters to beginning sounds. We've been learning the sight words I, A, can, see, went, have.
- In Math we continued our new unit on measurement. We've been comparing lengths of cube towers and we played grab and compare. We also worked on developing our number sense with fun bat number cards (#s 1-20.) We practiced identifying and writing numbers *before* and *after* a given number. Using a 100's chart really helped the kids understand the number patterns.
- We finally opened up our pumpkins and made exploration books. Ask your child if the pumpkins sank or floated! We compared our small/medium/large pumpkin, described the pumpkins inside and out, did a float experiment, counted the number of lines, and counted all of the seeds by putting them into groups of ten.
- We enjoyed celebrating Dia De Los Muertos with Ms. Perez's class!
