## Ms.Perez & Ms.Alison Highlights

This week we learned all about the life cycle of a plant. Did you know that a seedling will face the sun as soon as it comes out of the dirt? We continued practicing short vowel sounds and cvc (consonant/vowel/consonant) words. The students sorted difference shapes and made their own Shape Sorting Books. We also wrapped up our ocean unit and finished our ocean books which you will see at Open House in May.

Beginning next week, we will only have parents in class during morning drop off on Tuesdays and Thursdays. When we come back from Spring Break, students will getting dropped off at the door, coming into the class on their own, hanging up their backpacks, and starting their Morning Work independently.

## Ms.Hope & Ms.Mayes Highlights

This week we learned about where food comes from. We sorted products by whether they come from food or from animals. This activity helped us understand that most of the food we eat comes from farms.

In Writer's Workshop we are working on using finger spaces to separate our words to make them easier to read. We started using a checklist to remind us to use capitalization, punctuation and spaces.

In math we started a new unit that revisits and builds on many concepts that were introduced at the beginning of the year. We learned about measurement, particularly length. We measured different parts of our body using cubes and compared the lengths with a partner.

Everyone has been doing a great job with our farm expert groups! Each group is studying a different animal. Next week we will teach each other about the animals we studied.
